

PROJECT OVERVIEW

ITD is preparing for construction on 2.3 miles of US-95 north of Winchester in Lewis and Nez Perce counties. The project will add a new southbound passing lane to improve safety and traffic flow. The existing double barrel culverts at Rock Creek will be replaced with a three-sided concrete box culvert to accommodate widening and restore fish passage. Rock blasting and excavation will be required to accommodate the new passing lane. Construction is scheduled to run from spring through fall of 2022.

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

During most construction activities, one 11-foot-wide lane will be open in each direction. However, during rock blasting and cleanup, the highway will be completely closed for one to two hours at a time. The contractor will be restricted from blasting during the morning and late afternoon peak travel times, school bus times and holidays.

FUTURE PHASES

Phased construction in the canyon will add an 11-mile passing lane from Winchester to Culdesac. Following this year's 2.3 miles of construction, Phase 4 construction will tackle an additional 3 miles at the northern end of the corridor in 2024. Phase 5 will complete the final link in the corridor and will begin in 2026 to address the remaining 1.4 miles.


